all these prisons: be sides ~~when~~ my father or my self wen
once a wek to see how she deed and what she wanted and some
tyme twis a weke which was a gratt cost and damedg to our
estate my father wold often say that the cost and damedg
we sustained in our estate ~~were more than~~ twenty pounds and
if am intenciond he spok less then it was: be sides the los of so
dece a frind which can not be made up: all which I leue
to your honest consideration: I reman youk honoras humbl satua

yet not with standing twas twenty pounds
damdg to our estate considerg our nams may
be re paireed I am willing to take fourteen pounds
