

To the Honorable Committee Appointed by the Generall
Court to make enquire with respect to the sufferings in
the year 1692.

These are to give you a short Account of our sorrows which
was in the yere 1692 some time in march our father and mother
Giles Corey & martha his wife were accused ^{of} Poposed with craft
and impreisoned and were removed from on prison to another as from
Salem to Ipswich & from Ipswich to Boston and from ^{Boston} to Salem againe.
and soe remained in close imprisonment about four months we were all
the whole charge of their maintanance which was very chargable
and soe much the more being soe farre adistance from us also ^{less}
by the reason of soe many remoues in all which wee could doe not then
accompaine them. which further added both to our trouble and charge and
although that was very great is the least of our greavence at cause of
these lines but that which breakes and for which wee goe mourning still
is that our father was put to soe cruell and painfull a death as being
put to death our mother was put to death also though in another way.

And as wee cannot sufficiantly expreſſe our griffe for the loss
of our father and mother in such away ſo we cannot compute our
expences and coaſt but ſhall come to your wiſdome to ~~your wiſdome~~ to iudge
but after our fathers death the ſhipe threatend to ſizes our fathers plate
and for feare tharof wee complied with him and gaue him eleven pounds
ſix ſhillings in monie by all which wee have bee greatly daunted & impooreſhed
by being compelled to ſell creatures and other things for little more then halfe the
worth of them to get the monie to pay as aforēd and to maintaine our father or
in prison but that which is grieuous to us is that wee are not only
impoveriſhed but alſo reproached and ſo we may bee to all generations
and that wrongfully now unlesſ ſomthing ^{done} bee done for the remoueall thereof
all which wee humbly Committe to the honarable Court Praying God to
direct to that which may bee acceptable in his sight and for the good of
this land
