

The Deposition of mazy walcott aged about 17 years who testifieth
 and saith that on the later end of April 1692. mr. George Burroughs
 of his Appresance came to me whom I formerly well knew: and he did
 immediately most grievously torment me by biting pinching and almost
 choaking me urging me to writ in his book: which I refusing he did
 againe most grievously torment me and tould me if I would but touch
 his book I should be well but I tould him I would not for all the world
 and then he threatened to kil me and said I should never witness against
 him: but he continued tortoring and tempting me till the 8 may: and then
 he tould me he would have filed his first wife and child: when his wife
 was in travail but he had not power: but he kept his in the ^{cell} ~~cell~~
 till he gave his: his death wound: but he charged me in the name
 of his gods I should not tell of it: but immediately there appeared
 to me mr. Burroughs two first wives all in their winding sheets whom
 I formerly well knew and tould me that mr. Burroughs had murdered
 them and that their blood did cree for vengeance against him: also on
 the 9th may being the day of his examination he did most grievously
 torment me during the time of his examination for if he did but look
 on me he would strike me down or almost choake me: also during
 his examination I saw mr. George Burroughs or his Appresance most
 grievously torment mery lewes Elizabeth Hubbert Abigail William and Ann
 putnam and I believe in my heart that mr. George Burroughs is a
 dreadfull wizard and that he has often afflated and tormented
 me and the afore mentioned persons by his acts of witchcraft
