the 10th day of July last past were lawfully arraigned

On Several Indictments for a horrible Crime of Withering
by them practised & Committed on severall persons and
pleading not guilty did for thier Tryall put Hamble
On God & thier Countrey whoroughe they were Each of
them found & brought in Guilty by a Jury that
passed on them according to thier respective Indictments
and Sentence of death did then pass upon them as
the Law directly Execution wherof yet remains to
be done:

There and therefore in thier Majesties names William & Mary
now King & Queen over England &c. to will & Comand
you that upon Tuesday next being the 19th day of
Instant July between the hours of Eight & nine in
forenoon of same day you safely conduct the said Sarah
Rebecca Nurse Susanna Martin Elizabeth How & Sarah
Wild from thier Majesties Goal in Salem afores. to the
place of Execution & there cause them & Every of them
to be hanged by ye Nocks untill they be dead and of ye
doings herein make return to the Clerk of ye said Court
& this precept and hereof you are not to fail at your perill
and this shall be your sufficient Warrant Given under my
hand & scale at Boston the 12th day of July in the 5th
yeare of the Reigne of Our Sovereign Lord & Lady
